

#### CTechO Report – March 2023

We're still looking for additional help on both the maintenance and restoration crews. Please contact me at the hangar on Tuesdays and Saturdays, via email at <u>maintenance@harvards.com</u> or by phone at 519-320-1854 if you are interested. Here's an update on the current fleet status:

**Harvard 3830/C-FRWN** – Good ol' 54 came back online in mid-October, and has been on standby duty over the winter months for pilot recurrency and any potential flypasts we may have. We are planning on rectifying a couple of minor issues that were discovered in the Fall, after WPK and RZW have emerged from their winter maintenance programs.

**Harvard 20422/RZW** – 422 is about 95% of the way through her annual inspection, with no major issues encountered. We successfully replaced the wing-to-fuselage bolts, and inspected the fuel tank bays in the process. At the moment, we are finishing up any loose ends with the hopes of having the inspection completed in early March.

**Harvard 20242/C-FWPK** – The annual inspection on 242 is approximately 90% complete. We are currently working on getting the freshly repainted canopy sections ready for reinstallation.

**Harvard AJ583/C-FHWX** – The engine was successfully removed by our volunteers at the end of January, and was shipped down to Covington Aircraft in Oklahoma by mid-February. They will perform a tear-down inspection to determine if there is any internal damage to the engine, and we expect it to return in early 2024 (they are currently projecting an 11 month lead time) In the meantime, HWX will be stored, and we plan on starting work to bring the airframe back to airworthy condition later this year.


**Harvard 20304/C-FBZT** – Work on 304 has steadily continued, with AME Kerry Wilkinson planning on returning from vacation sometime in March. We are currently working on the electrical system, instrument lines, and engine bay components to ensure everything is up to airworthy operational standards. Barring any extraordinary circumstances, BZT will fly this year!

**Harvard 20321/CF-UFZ/'Bessy'** – Our beloved Bessy has been stored in the North Hangar over the winter, with only a few small behind-the-scenes projects such as the instrument panels making any progress in the cold weather. We are planning on bringing UFZ back to the front burner very shortly, in preparation for sending the airframe to be stripped and repainted once we reach warmer temps.


**Harvard 20436/C-FWLH** – No major updates since the last report, however some work is continuing to take place to make 436 appear more complete in order to be used for cockpit tours.

**Yale 3399/C-GLJH** – We performed a ground run on the Yale in mid-January, and removed the propeller for overhaul shortly afterwards. The prop is now at H&S Propeller in Michigan, and should be back in April. Once WPK and RZW are out of the maintenance hangar, we will begin LJH's annual inspection immediately. As she has not flown since 2015, this year's inspection will be extra thorough, and I have already compiled a lengthy to-do list for our maintenance crew. Once the overhauled propeller is reinstalled and the annual inspection is complete, 3399 will be have a short flight to Waterloo (CYKF) sometime this summer in order for FliteLine to replace two of her wing attach angles. Once this repair has been completed, we will have a fully functioning Yale ready for passenger flights.

**Harvard 3191/C-FMTX** – The restoration crew is making good progress in the disassembly, stripping and inspecting of MTX's parts. We're also working on building stands to hold the tail cone and cockpit tubular structure, with the latter being sent out for ultrasonic NDT inspection later this year.
