



#### **CTECHO Report**

#### **Shane Clayton**

We're still looking for additional help on both the maintenance and restoration crews. Please contact me at the hangar on Tuesdays and Saturdays, via email at maintenance@harvards.com or by phone at 519-320-1854 if you are interested. Here's an update on the current fleet status:

Harvard 3830/C-FRWN – RWN has been running steady all season with no major issues. She is due for annual inspection in October, so we will look at starting that maintenance program in late September in order to be online for our formation fly pasts scheduled for this fall.

Harvard 20422/RZW – 422 has been flying since early April, and was only offline briefly to facilitate a propeller swap. The prop she had been fitted with since 2019 was causing some occasional over speed issues, and has now been sent to H&S Propeller in Michigan for repair. Once it returns, it will be installed on 20304/BZT. We will be flying RZW up until Remembrance Day, and will probably be going in for her annual inspection shortly after that.

Harvard 20242/C-FWPK – We've been flying 242 constantly since early April, with no major issues. Like RZW, we'll probably be taking WPK offline shortly after Remembrance Day for her annual inspection.

Harvard AJ583/C-FHWX – No major updates since the last report, however some work is ongoing to create repair fixtures for the wing flaps that were slightly damaged in the wheels-up landing. We're still on track to have HWX ready to fly again in the first half of 2024.

Harvard 20304/C-FBZT – Work is continuing at a steady pace, taking care of each system, circuit by circuit, piece by piece. A lot of undiscovered issues have been resolved, and we are well on our way to seeing BZT flying before the end of the year.

Harvard 20321/CF-UFZ/'Bessy' – The maintenance crew is hard at work getting Bessy ready for her trip to the paint shop. We're waiting to hear back from PPG Canada about possibly getting some or all of the paint and primer donated. Depending on the delivery schedule, we're planning on getting UFZ soda blasted and into the paint booth sometime in the next month or two.

Harvard 20436/C-FWLH – No major updates since the last report, however some work is continuing to take place to make 436 appear more complete in order to be used for cockpit tours.

Yale 3399/C-GLJH – Work has continued on the Yale's annual inspection at a steady pace. The propeller has been delayed a bit at the overhaul shop, but should be here sometime in September. We're still making progress in sourcing the replacement wing attach angles, however the last quote that we received was a bit higher than anticipated. It looks like we won't be able to receive the new angles until the spring, so we'll make sure that LJH is ready to go when the time comes!

Harvard 3191/C-FMTX – The restoration crew is still making good progress in the disassembly, stripping and inspecting of MTX's cockpit area parts. We're also working on building stands to hold the tail cone and cockpit tubular structure, with the latter being send out for ultrasonic NDT inspection later this year. Once BZT is flying, it'll be full steam ahead on MTX!
